Welcome: Members, Friends and Honored Guests,

Tonight, as we celebrate the 249th Anniversary of the founding of The Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick, I'm happy to report that our Society is thriving. Having recently added over 200 new members, this evening we celebrate with nearly 550 invitees in attendance, our largest gala in many years. These figures bode well as we approach our Semiquincentennial in 2021 and 250 years of commitment to emulating the values and ideals of our namesake, Saint Patrick.

Hope, Faith, and Determination are central tenets of our Patron Saint and have sustained the Irish throughout history. Faced with discrimination, starvation and oppression, the Irish not only endured, but ultimately prospered both in Ireland and abroad, by relying on these core values.

In America, the Irish faced many of the same challenges they left behind. As they settled in a new land, they also decided not to settle. As the Irish departed their native land, they left behind their homes and family, but always carried their memories of Ireland with them, some fond and some better forgotten.

As the first Irish immigrants arrived at Philadelphia's ports, the Friendly Sons provided much needed relief and aid -- a helping hand that would allow Irish men and women a foothold and an opportunity to begin to pursue their own version of the American dream.

Like Patrick, the Irish knew how to turn adversity into opportunity. They helped to build our cities, railroads, and factories. When not using their brawn, they used their intellect -- rising to dominant leadership positions in Business, Labor, Law, Government and Academia.

Today, members of The Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick, remain determined to make a difference in our community, and strive to provide Hope and Faith to those in need. In 2019, we established three new educational scholarship endowments. One at Saint Mary's College in South Bend, IN, a second at Saint Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, PA and a third at Cardinal John Foley Regional Catholic School, Havertown, PA, totaling \$232,000.00. Additionally, a Gaelic Athletic Association (GAA) Scholarship of \$25,000.00 will help provide financial aid for youth enrollment fees and expenses. Lastly, a donation in support of the Little Sisters of the Poor's building project at the Holy Family home in Southwest Philadelphia, PA for \$100,000.00 was provided.

As we celebrate tonight, and prepare to march tomorrow, we give thanks for our heritage and culture -- and perhaps tonight a taste of "uisge beatha", the "Water of Life". Happy St. Patrick's Day, and good luck and good health to you all!

MAURICE H. FITZPATRICK Heimbold Chair of Irish Studies at Villanova University



Maurice H. Fitzpatrick is a graduate of Trinity College Dublin and was a recipient of the Japanese Ministry of Education scholarship 2004-2017 and a lecturer at Keio University, Tokyo, 2004-11, and a lecturer at the University of Cologne 2012-2016. He has made two documentary films for the BBC: The Boys of St. Columb's (also an Irish public television RTÉ production) which tells the story of the first generation of children to receive free secondary education as a result of the ground-breaking 1947 Education Act in Northern Ireland, whose participants included St. Columbs' Nobelists John Hume and Seamus Heaney; and a second film for the BBC, an examination of Brian Friel's play, Translations. In 2017, he wrote, directed and produced a documentary feature film, In the Name of Peace: John Hume in America. He is also the author of a book entitled John Hume in America (University of Notre Dame Press, 2019). Maurice was a Poynter Fellow at Yale University in 2018 and is currently the Heimbold Chair of Irish Studies at Villanova University.

DR. JOHN TEELING Chairman, The Great Northern Distillery Chairman, 162 Group



Dr. John Teeling is one of Ireland's leading entrepreneurs. John Teeling was sponsored by the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick to study at and attain his MBA at the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School of Business, after which he went on to earn a doctorate in business at Harvard University.

Throughout a long business career in Ireland, John has been involved in a wide spectrum of business ranging from textiles to exploration. John Teeling has also led the renaissance in Irish Whiskey. In 1987, Mr. Teeling established the first new Irish distillery in over 100 years in Cooley, Ireland (Co. Louth) and subsequently re-opened the Lockes Distillery (Kilbeggan, Co. Westmeath). The group was later sold to Jim Beam in 2011. John went on to establish the Great Northern Distillery on the former Harp Brewery site, which operates both single malt and grain distilleries on one site in Dundalk, Ireland (Co. Louth). It is now the second largest distilling company in Ireland.

As an investor in mining and oil since 1983, he has founded a number of Stock Exchange listed explorers. He currently chairs four, having sold three in recent years. He explores for diamonds, gold, oil and zinc in Africa, Ireland and the Middle East.

John, who lectured in Business Administration at University College Dublin for 20 years, also holds degrees with his alma mater, University College Dublin (B. Comm, M. Econ Sc.).

SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT TO FSSP MEMBERSHIP

MARCH 5, 2020

It is a pleasure and a privilege to be able to report on another excellent year for the Society of the Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick. It's particularly gratifying that we celebrate this year's Gala at the Bellevue Hotel. 114 years ago, our members hosted the hotel's first ever Saint Patrick's Day celebration, and it became a tradition that lasted for over 70 years. Our return to the Bellevue is a reflection of a renewed commitment to growth, with the 2020 Gala the best attended in many decades.

We take great pride in the fact that our Society is older than the United States itself and that its early members played an important role in the founding of our nation. The first Friendly Sons were as proud to be American as they were proud to be Irish, and they never forgot their roots. Despite all that has changed since 1771, I believe our founders would recognize in today's Society the same basic spirit that inspired them from the very beginning.

We continue to cherish both the heart and soul of the Irish and the American spirit of liberty and charity. And to illustrate that, I have a few highlights of which all of our members, past and present, should be proud:

- In 2019, we created an initiative to donate up to \$250,000 in matching grants as we prepare for our 250th anniversary next year.
- We established a \$100,000 scholarship endowment at St. Mary's College thanks to the generosity of Ed & Lisa Wilbraham.
- We created our first high school scholarship, with a new \$100,000 scholarship endowment at St. Joseph's Prep, thanks to the generosity of Kevin and Annie Maloney and Mike and Kim Maloney.
- We initiated a \$25,000 scholarship to support participants of the Gaelic Athletic Association, helping to encourage and support Irish games and traditions right here in our own backyard.
- In 2019 alone, we raised \$174,000 to be

distributed to worthy charitable causes, including the Notre Dame Cathedral Rebuild, Foroige Youth Group, Duffy's Cut Project, 174 Trust, Immaculate Heart of Mary Convent, Little Sisters of the Poor, Mercy Hospice, St. John's Hospice, Ivins Outreach Center, Irish Immigration Center, Shamrock Reins and so many others.

- We increased our existing scholarships endowments at Villanova University, St. Joseph's University, Neumann University, Gwynned University, Arcadia University, Rosemont College, Cabrini University, Immaculata University, and Camphill Special Schools.
- Through our endowments, twenty students traveled to Ireland this year.
- Since 2015, the Society's scholarship endowments have grown from \$70,000 to over \$1,300,000, and grants during that time have totaled \$805,000.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed so generously to these accomplishments. I particularly want to thank the outgoing board members for their part in helping our Society flourish and grow in the past couple of years: John Heenan, Kevin Maginnis, Theresa Murtagh, Bob Whalen, Brendan Gallagher, and last but not least, President Kevin Maloney. We owe you all a great debt of gratitude.

Finally, I want to welcome the incoming board members and the 90 new members who have joined us in the past year. As incoming President, I look forward to working with all our members, old and new, to build on our Society's tradition of benevolence and charitable endeavors as we approach next year's 250th anniversary.

On the right Hibernia — on the left America — in the center Liberty joining the hands of Hibernia and America, represented by the usual figures of a female supported by a Harp for Hibernia — an Indian with his guiver on his back, and his bow slung, for America — underneath Unite. On the reverse, St. Patrick trampling on a snake — a cross in his hand—dressed in Pontificahbus, — the motto "Hier."

These devices, designed some years before the Revolution, were certainly ominous, if not prophetic, — The Goddess of Liberty" joining the hands of Hibernia and America, with the superscription, "Unite," was sufficiently significant, considering that the effect of that union powerfully promoted the subsequent dismemberment of the British Empire, and the establishment of the liberty and independence of America. The motto Hier, or, without the aspirate, Iar, In the Celtic Language, signifies "West," — and from it came the name of the country Ere, Erin, or Ireland; and Ierna, aspirated Hibernia. But the word "Hier" had in it a duplicate and equivocal signification; peculiarly appropriate as the motto of a society whose object was to "Unite," in fellowship, the sons of the little Isle of the "West," with those of the great continent of the "West."
